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




Genesis 1:26 – 2:7 Recap

- Every human being is created in God's Image
- God created humans to represent Him, to reproduce, and to rule over creation
- There are two genders male and female
- All humankind is descended from Adam
- The Sabbath rest is a pattern for our work week
- Gen. 1 reveals Elohim (powerful) and Gen. 2 reveals Yahweh (personal)
- The breath of God is the source of life

Where was the Garden of Eden?



Garden of Eden (Gen. 2:8-17)

- Eden was most likely in Mesopotamia.
- Adam's Job → To work and keep God's garden.
- Why the command to not eat of one tree?
 - We are created in His image; therefore, we have freedom to choose; true love is never forced (Dt. 30:15: "I have set before you life and death...therefore, choose life.")
- What are the consequences of disobedience?
 - "You will surely die" (both spiritual and physical)
 - Spiritual death was immediate; physical death was guaranteed

| God walking in the garden (3:8) | God dwells His people (21:3) |

Marriage – Problem Identified (vs. 18)

- "Not good" first time God mentions that something is not good (man was designed for horizontal relationships as well as his vertical one with God)
- "Helper" (helpmate; Hebrew "ezer" also used to describe God) = emphasizes the complementary and compatibility aspects of the male/female relationship (body, soul, spirit)

Marriage – Problem Recognized (vs. 19-20)

- Naming of the animals:
 - Humans are once again distinguished
 - Adam recognized he did not have a partner
- Marriage context one male and one female (cf. Gen. 1:28 – "be fruitful and multiply, fill the earth and subdue it") – cf. Matt. 19:4-5

Marriage – Problem Solved (vs. 21-24)

- "Deep sleep" = God is the only Creator of life
- "Rib from his side" = completion; complementary; co-equal; co-rulers
- "Brought the woman to the man" so that Adam could name her
- Covenantal: "A cord of three strands is not easily broken" (Eccl. 4:12) – becoming one flesh
- Marriage emulates Christ and His church (Eph. 5)
- They were not ashamed

Gen. 2 Recap

- Adam's job = work and keep God's garden.
- The consequences of disobedience are spiritual and physical death.
- Adam recognized his lack of a partner.
- God's forming a wife from Adam's side points to Christ and His bride, the church.
 - Therefore, marriage is a covenant.
