
Genesis 4 Recap

- 1. Worship (vs. 1-8)
- 2. Wandering (vs. 9-16)
- 3. Waywardness (vs. 17-24)

Biblical Genealogies:

- 1. Establish the historical timeline.
- 2. Emphasize God's faithfulness.
- 3. Embody God's plan of redemption.
- 4. Exemplify how God uses people to accomplish His purpose.

CHRONOLOGY CHART FROM ADAM TO ABRAHAM Lifespan of the Biblical Patriarchs



1. Genealogy (Toledot) of Seth

- Seth = granted; appointed one
- In the image/likeness of Adam
- Call on the Name of the Lord
- Contrasts Cain's legacy
- Offers hope of a restored relationship
 - Points to the Messiah, Jesus Christ

2. Example of Enoch

- Walked with God
 - 1. Worship
 - 2. Work
 - 3. Witness
- Listed in the Hall of Faith (Heb. 11)
- Called a "prophet" (Jude 1:14)
- Taken did not experience death

Genesis 1-5 Recap

- 1. Creation occurred in 6 literal 24-hour days.
- 2. All humans are created in the image of God.
- 3. God is the source of life.
- 4. God instituted marriage.
- 5. Adam and Eve disobeyed God.
 - 6. Cain killed Abel out of jealousy.
- 7. God's plan of redemption is established in Seth.
